Annual Meeting Report by Becky Snider

NCAGG's Annual Meeting, Auction and Sale took place on October 3, 2021 at the home of Becky Snider and Karen Cone in Silver Spring. It was the Guild's first in-person meeting in more than 18 months. The Guild provided BBQ catered by Famous Dave's and drinks and attendees brought side dishes and desserts. We had lots of great food and almost everyone took home leftovers. The apple strudel made by Michaela Borghese was one of the highlights of the meal.

The business of the Annual Meeting included a welcome by President Tamah Graber, Board elections, and a short summary of upcoming events. The slate of officers for the Board of Directors all ran unopposed and were elected unanimously. Tamah Graber will continue as President for another year. The rest of the reelected Board includes Andrew Lang as Vice-President, Suzanne Arden as Treasurer, Sarah Pick as Secretary, Jenn Moffit as Past-President and three Directors – Allan Jaworski, Sherry Selevan and Becky Snider.

After the business part of the Annual Meeting was taken care of, the fun began with the drawing of door prizes. Ten attendees won \$10 gift certificates for Weisser Glass generously donated by Nancy Weisser. The auction this year consisted of 12 boxed lots of frit donated by Pat Arnold. Each box contained either 8 – 1 pound jars of Bullseye frit or powder or 10 jars of Uroboros frit or powder. Long-time Guild member Nikki O'Neill organized this donation and was this year's auctioneer. The starting bid for each lot was \$40 and most lots sold for \$50 - \$65. Some lots contained expensive jars of powder including Sunset Coral and Erbium Pink, which both retail for more than \$40 per pound.

In addition to the items up for auction, this year, we also had hundreds of items for sale, which were donated by Guild members Pat Arnold, Shirley Hendel, and Debbie LoCicero, former Guild member Jackie Braitman and others. We got so many donations that it was impossible to auction off each item. Instead, attendees got to shop in Becky and Karen's garage which was filled with stained and fusible sheet glass, bags of scrap glass and frit, Bullseye glass billets, dozens of slumping molds, and all kinds of stained glass and fusing tools and supplies. Almost everyone in attendance found something to take home. In total, proceeds from the auction and sale amounted to \$1,757.78.

www.callforentry.org is a site that promotes artist's works by giving them a chance to register for shows and residencies around the world. Each listing tells whether the show is national, international, or students only. It lists a theme for the show and, with one click you can learn all the details.

Callforentry.org is a one-stop-shop allowing you to upload images, submit to shows, pay any entry fees, and provides you with a weekly email list upcoming show opportunities.
